




White to move and win

A wall of white pawns against a wall of black ones. How can white storm to victory?


Let's try charging from the left: 1.e5? fe 2.h5 ef 3.hg f3 4.g7. After 4...f2 5.g8豐 f1豐# white is mated. So we need to charge from the right:

- **1.h5!! gh** (1...g5 2.e5! f5 3.gf! g4 4.f6! etc.) **2.e5!** It's now time to charge from the left!
- 2...fe 3.f5! hg 4.f6! g3 5.f7, and white wins as his pawn is promoted with check.




White to move and win

Will white's rook pawn make it to the 8<sup>th</sup> rank? Well, that depends on white's other pawn!

**1.a5 \$\delta\$68 2.\$\delta\$d5 \$\delta\$h6 3.g5**+!! **\$\text{\$\text{\$\delta}\$g5.}** 3...\$\delta\$xg5 4.a6 etc. is no better.

4. \$\ddot\delta\$h4 5. \$\ddot\delta\$f3! \$\ddot\delta\$f5 6.a6, and white wins.
